Today, state and local law enforcement agencies must find ways to optimize dwindling resources while maintaining the highest level of service possible to the communities they serve. To achieve these goals, they must invest in new technologies to make operations more efficient and cost-effective. One way to do so — without tapping already overstretched operating budgets — is through **asset forfeiture funding**.

Asset Forfeiture: Taking a Financial Bite Out of Crime

Asset forfeiture laws strike at the economic foundations of crime by allowing for the seizure and eventual forfeiture of property associated with criminal activity. The U.S. Department of Justice Assets Forfeiture Fund (AFF) was established when Congress enacted the Comprehensive Crime Control Act of 1984. (Similar to the AFF is the U.S. Treasury Department's Treasury Forfeiture Fund.) Proceeds from the sale of forfeited assets are deposited into the AFF and used to further law enforcement initiatives. Under the AFF's Equitable Sharing Program, sale proceeds may be shared with the state and local law enforcement agencies that participated in the investigations that led to the seizure of the assets.¹

State and local agencies can use shared asset forfeiture funds to purchase technology that streamlines operations and contains costs, such as the Kronos® TeleStaff™ solution. These funds can also be combined with other monies, such as grants, to invest in Kronos TeleStaff.

Why Kronos TeleStaff?

Due to budget cuts, many departments are still staffing officers using labor-intensive, time-consuming manual processes. Kronos TeleStaff automates the entire scheduling, communication, and time management process, minimizing labor costs and maximizing efficiency so you can focus on higher-priority issues. It also meets DOJ Equitable Sharing Program regulations as permissible for law enforcement use.




FIGURE 1. Results of a 2010 customer survey showing the significant time savings using the Kronos TeleStaff solution over manual processes to complete 10 operational tasks.

Kronos TeleStaff is used by over 700 public safety organizations across North America. **A 2010 survey showed that Kronos TeleStaff customers average an 82 percent time savings and perform tasks six times faster in the areas of building schedules, assigning shifts, filling vacancies, reporting exceptions, bidding, emergency recall, and special event staffing.**² (See Figure 1.)
